

Follow up activity ideas for At The Movies

Read the book about going to the movies again (it was sent out with the confirmation email) or watch the story in our recording of the session on our website here: <u>https://talklink.org.nz/virtual-kiwichat-groups</u>

Talk about the story

Use these suggestions as points to talk about using your communication system. (Adults: remember to use the communication device to model vocabulary)

Read the book again and talk about...

- 1. Your favourite movie, type of movie, or movie star and why you like them.
- 2. Movies are fun because...
- 3. What are your favourite movie time snacks?
- 4. Who do you like to watch movies with, and where do you like to watch them?

Other books to read

Many movies are based on books. See if you can find books that match your favourite movies. What is the same? What is different?

Other activities

Here are some ideas for other activities related to the Movies theme:

- Plan your own day at the movies (maybe for end of term?):
 - What movies might you choose? How will you decide which one to watch?
 - o Make tickets
 - Make snacks and drinks
 - Set up your own movie theatre (at school or at home)
 - Role play the process of buying a ticket, buying snacks etc
- Create a poster for your favourite movie.
- Write a movie review
- Act out a scene from your favourite movie (or book). Have some one video record it and share with your friends and family.
- Watch a short clip from a movie and decide what might happen next you can talk about it, write about it or act it out.
- Use pictures of your favourite characters or actors to play games like Guess Who or 20 Questions.
- Make a list of important things that happen in a movie and see if others can put them in the right order.
