THEME OF THE DAY: Fun at the Fair

9.45am Arrival and introductions Students and carers will be welcomed and introduced to staff

running the day. It would be great if students could use their

communication device to greet staff and other students.

Morning Tea

We ask that students bring their own food and drinks,

We ask that students bring their own food and drinks, as some may have special dietary requirements. This is a great opportunity to talk to friends and see what they have been doing at their school. We will have tea and coffee available

for adults.

Whole group introduction Who has been to a fair? Have you tried the rollercoaster?

Let's imagine we are all riding the biggest rollercoaster in the

world

We are off to the fair now. We will need money to buy

tickets. How much money do you need?

Students will work in small groups and explore the fairground. Use KiwiChat money to pay for the games you

want to play.

Whack 'n Splat! Use a mallet to whack 'n splat, creating a gorgeous piece of

art at the same time.

Hook a Duck How many ducks can you hook in a minute? Count them up

to see who the winner is.

Tin Can Alley How's your aim? Take turns to knock down as many tins as

you can.

Sponge Throw Uh oh! Someone's going to get wet!

Tattoo Booth Choose a tattoo. Tell someone else about your tattoo.

Students return to large group

Large group activity:
Potato and Spoon race

Let's run some silly races! Get ready to cheer on your team

mates.

Vocabulary suggestions: We are promoting the use of core words for our students

who are using communication systems. Words related to colour, shape and size and describing words will all be great. These might be words such as turn, finish, good, bad, make, big, small, strong, help, go, stop. There will also be low-tech

resources available.

Reminders:

Students who would benefit from KiwiChat Days are:

- Students
 - o who have been referred to TalkLink (are on the waitlist or are having an assessment at the moment)
 - who are in Follow Up (have already had a TalkLink assessment and have a communication system)
 - who you are thinking of referring to TalkLink and want to show their teacher/teacher aide/parent what communication systems look like (please talk to your TalkLink therapist before bringing a non-TalkLink referred student)
- Students who do not have extreme behaviours and will not struggle with the length of time being in the session and busy environment (if they are really overwhelmed and cannot cope with being present then they don't tend to get a lot out of the session and often cause other students to become upset). Chat to your TalkLink therapist if you are not sure!
- Have an adult who will be able to stay the whole time and take part in the activities and who
 wants to learn more about modelling and using communication systems

Adults who attend are expected to:

- Stay the whole time
- Have a communication system on you at all time, e.g. wear your core board, PODD book or other communication system throughout the sessions
- Model communication on the system the whole session

- Remember that the goal of the activities is not to finish the whole activity but rather to
 engage in social interactions and practice using your communication system with familiar
 and unfamiliar people
- Remember to take lots of time to wait (don't keep asking the questions again and again –
 just give the student time to think and come up with their own answer)
- Remember to let your student answer (even if they are struggling and you know what they are trying to say, give them the opportunity to give it a go)
- Help support your student if they are struggling with the noisy/busy environment, e.g. take them outside to have a sensory break and then come back into the session after 5minutes
- Remember No side talk with other adults you are here to support your student to use their communication system, so if you want to talk to another adult please do so outside of the session
