I should not take food or drinks from other people. I should eat the snacks that belong to me.




It gets dark inside the theatre. When it gets dark, the movie will begin. At the end of the movie, the lights will get bright again.

When the movie is over, I leave the theatre.

I should leave through the door that says "EXIT".

I should not open a door that is for emergencies.

I put my rubbish in the bin as I leave.

After I leave, I can tell my family and friends about the movie.
